This year, AAK was honored at the Association of Professional Societies In East Africa (APSEA) Awards, receiving the Collaborations & Partnership, and Workplace Diversity & Inclusion Awards. These accolades are a testament to our unwavering dedication to excellence and partnership.













In line with our mission to provide value to our members, we launched the AAK Benevolent Fund, which supports members during times of bereavement. We encourage all members to subscribe to this initiative here.

Our chapter activities, have showcased the diversity and vibrancy of our membership. Highlights include the Golf Tournament, CPD events, Build Tours, the prestigious AAK Duracoat Awards of Excellence in Architecture 2024, and the Landscape Architects Chapter Symposium. Student mentorship has also been a cornerstone of our efforts this year. We have engaged with academic institutions to mentor young professionals including secondary and primary schools.
