

- Formed a Task Force for professionals in the Built Environment + Health Experts
 - HANDBOOK
- Information dissemination where we held upto 20+ webinars
- Worked with Government to assist in creation of spaces to manage the pandemic – hospital reorganization, setting up of field hospitals, innovation of handwashing stations etc

 Immediate design input on retrofitting of existing hospitals and schools required for Covid-19 Patients

2. Innovative Design Solutions container conversion, retrofitting of facilities, isolation units





3. Urban Scale solutions - mapping out identified facilities, urban parks and fields from city, neighbourhood, county level

 Public Health solutions on sanitization, provision of water, emergency accesses etc.





 Post Covid-19 strategies: longterm interventions and regulations, policies, legislation, guidelines on urban management



Homes

- The home became the first line of defense – LOCKDOWN
- All activities take place here
- Sick Building Syndrome (SBS) where poor lighting and lack of natural ventilation became glaring
- Shortage of clean water for combating the disease



HEALTHY HOME



- Homes as places for living and other activities
- Functional private offices
- Include a self-contained section for isolation
- Proper natural ventilation and admission of daylight
- Increase room sizes
- Automated systems
- Outdoor Activities
- A redesign of the entrance lobby for sanitization
- Storage spaces for food will be more necessary





- Lack of community participation in their design
 - High urban population densities Congestion
 - Poor Public Transport systems



HEALTHY PUBLIC SPACES

Appreciation of the outdoors and nature greatly increased due to the pandemic

Short term:

- Increase hygiene in the public spaces
- Street pedestrianization

Long term:

- Revitalize existing parks (open and safe)
- Guidelines for adaptive use of open spaces for emergencies



THE JUST CITY PRINCIPLES FOR KENYA



DIGNITY

The right of an individual or group to be valued, respected and treated ethicaly. To recognize the worthiness of a human individual or a group. It implies respect of the individual or a group regardless of their perceived socio-economic or political status.

EQUITY AND DIVERSITY

A city with equity has its benefits shared fairly amongst all the citizens; A city with diversity has an understanding that democratic processes may result in exclusion of some and measures are put in place to protect rights of minorities



DEMOCRACY

A city where citizens make collective decisions in a manner that respects dignity of all, protects rights of minorities and considers equity and diversity.



RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A city where the rights of all citizens and visitors are observed. Citizens take their space to excercise their rightful responsibilities to develop their own city
